Did you know that the ancient Olympic Games at Olympia in Greece were held every 4th year, it is thought, from 776 B.C. until 393 That's a period of over 1000 years! The last games in 393 A.D was the 293rd Olympiad. Unlike the modern Olympics, the ancient Olympics included music and poetry as well as athletic endeavour. In those days, competitors had to prove that they were unstained by crime or immorality - the victors were crowned with garlands of wild olive leaves, not gold medals. The London Olympics in 2012 will only be the 30th games of the modern era - just imagine, we will be well into the thirtieth century before we catchup with the ancient Greeks. (I wonder if they will have the ticketing website working properly by then?)

EVENTS SCHEDULING MEETING

Plans for the Oswestry Games are moving along at an Olympic pace. We are holding a meeting on **Thursday**, 12th May, to which all clubs and schools are invited, where we can discuss what we have managed to achieve so far and start scheduling the events. Some of the early plans are outlined below:

EVENTS

John Sharpe at **Croesoswallt Archery Club** is trying to move the North Wales Championships to fall within the week of the Oswestry Games – that will be a great event to have in Oswestry just two weeks before the Olympic archery starts at Lord's Cricket ground, London.

Berwyn and Dee Pony Club are looking at the possibility of an equestrian event in the area. This will be a very exciting and a top class event to have during our games.

QUESTION OF SPORT






1834... WE HAD IT FIRST!! ⊙

Sleuthing about in the County Archives, we found a handbill that suggests that a form of Olympic Games was held in Oswestry in 1834 – that predates the generally accepted story about the modern Olympics starting in Much Wenlock by nearly 20 years! The sporting 'Gaymes' were held in Salop Road in Oswestry in August 1834.

PEACE CELEBRATIONS IN CAE GLAS PARK

John Waine has unearthed a poster in Oswestry Library describing the 'Peace Celebrations' A Programme of Athletics Sports in Cae Glas Park held in 1919. We are hoping to re-create one of the events put on that day, 'The Band Race'. This is a



wonderful event where teams of 2 are given a piece of sheet music. One member of the team has to run to his team-mate at other end of the playing field, who plays the piece of music. His team-mate has to identify it and run back to the finish line and tell the title of

the tune to the judge. The winner is the first man back with the correct answer!
